

Explore America250: A Journey Through Time at the RLA



A Journey Through Time returns to the RLA with an **entirely new exhibit**, showcasing the complete 2025 publication by the *Butler Eagle* newspaper. This is the 3rd and final installation of the America 250 Butler County publication. The first and second exhibits ran in 2024 and 2025.

From **January 19, 2026 through July 31, 2026**, visitors are invited to explore a year of historical research displayed in the mezzanine gallery at the RLA. This 90-foot-long exhibit features rare archival photos, stories, maps, and more from the *Butler Eagle's America250: A Journey Through Time* series, covering U.S., Pennsylvania, and Butler County history.

A Must-See Exhibit for History Enthusiasts

"There's something new to learn every time you visit," said Amy Pack, president of the Butler County Tourism & Convention Bureau and a member of the America250 county committee. "This exhibit is an opportunity to celebrate Butler County and reflect on the important and notable history that sometimes gets forgotten."

America250 is a nonpartisan initiative commemorating the 250th anniversary of the signing of the U.S. Declaration of Independence in 1776. The *Butler Eagle* launched its newspaper series in January 2023, and this exhibit brings its final full year to life in a visually compelling display as we soon celebrate America's 250th birthday.

A Community-Centered Historical Experience

"The idea was to create a unique publication that brings this history together," said Tammy Schuey, *Butler Eagle* publisher and America250 committee member. "The display at the RLA represents the first year of this effort."

With approximately 1,000 people visiting the RLA weekly for conferences, classes, and events, the exhibit has become a point of interest and conversation. "The last two exhibits saw thousands of visitors of all ages and we hope those same visitors and many more will come see this new and final installation," said Dr. Justin Griffith, RLA's Chief Executive Officer.
